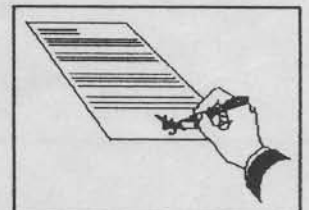

FRIDAY: 1:00 PM onwards -Reception & Registration at Balmoral Hall (Barry's Bay)

- i. Fee for use of main dining room and patio.
- ii. Coffee & muffins to be catered by hotel.
- iii. 8:00-9:00 PM Bar-b-que or corn roast.

SATURDAY: AM - Meet at Balmoral Hotel and travel to Combermere

- i. Will provide maps with points of interest for those wishing to drive their own cars.
- ii. Hire local bus to drive all (for a fee)
Tour Yandeu/Yondau farms

10:00 - Noon - Madonna House in Combermere on Highway 517
The Pioneer Museum open Tues-Sat 10-12 1-5.

Noon - 1:00 - Picnic lunch at Stevenson Lodge - a short walk from the Madonna House. For \$2.50 @ head we can have full use of the grounds, dock, swimming etc.

There is a Pioneer Day Parade held at Madawaska on Saturday. This town is on Hwy 60 about 35 Km west of Barry's Bay. Some of the activities there are: jello eating contest, face painting etc.

ACCOMMODATION:

1. Motels are located on Hwy 60 east & west of Barry's Bay.
2. Balmoral Hotel facility is quaint, clean and comfortable. Two full baths shared between guests plus ladies and gents on ground floor. No a/c but usually cool because of breeze from water. This requires two nights minimum stay prepaid!

3. There are many lodges in the area but the shortest rental is one week (Sat to Sat).

4. Camping facilities are numerous...many sites close to Combermere plus Algonquin Park and Carson Lake Provincial Park are close by. Tourism is now the main industry in the area.

Beverly Smith was advised that everyone should make their own arrangements well in advance and prepay for two nights. We will provide a price list and more information when plans are finalized.

TRANSPORTATION:

By Car For those arriving by car there is plenty of parking at the Balmoral Hotel & Seniors/Center.

BY AIR:

Ottawa is the closest major airport. Approximately 2-3 hr drive to Barry's Bay.

Toronto is almost a five hour drive any route.

PEM AIR:

Provides a connecting flight from Toronto to Pembroke Airport. This airport is about one hour drive from Barry's Bay - Hertz rental cars available at airport IF PRE-ARRANGED from Pembroke office.

Pam Air rates are high but the manager will negotiate if we book and prepay for all "13" seats. Flight times and fares will be quoted when arrangements finalized.

BUS:

Voyageur Bus service is available

1. Ottawa to Barry's Bay via Pembroke.
2. Toronto to Barry's Bay via Bancroft.

Timetable and fares will be quoted when arrangements finalized.

Miscellaneous Suggestions:

Some families may want to vacation the area. The tourist information office is presently located in the old RR station directly across from the Balmoral Hotel.

Places to visit.

1. Ottawa City
2. Chalk River - nuclear station
3. Algonquin Park - 100 years old - offers camping, fishing etc.
4. Madawaska River - rafting
5. Bonnechere Caves
6. Buffalo Farm on way to Pembroke from Barry's Bay
7. Bancroft "Jamboree" - Gemologists come from all over the world to this event as the area has such a great variety of minerals and stones.
