## GUINDON CONNECTIONS

An article on the Mayflower was printed Aug 15 1995 in THIS WEEK, Barry's Bay, Ontario after the GUINDON/YANDEAU REUNION held on the Civic Holiday.

Captain **Dougal Gates** and **Mary (Minnie) Agnes Yondau** daughters wanted to share their story about their father who rescued the *Mayflower* survivors.

The story of the sinking of the *Mayflower* is famous through the area. It occurred on a cold November night in 1912. Three men survived the ordeal by floating to land on a coffin carrying the body of John Brown.

As the story has been told over the years, some important information has been left out, such as who brought the three men and the coffin to the mainland?

And now for the rest of the story...

Dougal Gates was the Captain of the *Ruby*, a 41-foot boat built in 1903 and weighing in at 8.79 tons registered. The boat was owned by the Canada Corundum Company at the time of the sinking of the *Mayflower*.

Earlier in the day of November 12, 1912, the *Ruby* and *Mayflower* had an occurrence. While docking the *Mayflower*, owner and operator John Hudson accidentally brushed against the *Ruby*, not knowing that later, this boat and captain would be rescuing the only three survivors of a shipwreck.

On the evening of November 12, 1912, William Boehme talked Hudson into returning to Barry's Bay from Combermere to pick up the coffin carrying John Brown, whose family resided in Palmer Rapids.

On the return trip from Barry's Bay to Combermere, there were ten passengers along with the crew on the *Mayflower*.

The crewmembers were owner John (Jack) Hudson, ship fireman J. Tom Delaney and first mate Aaron Parcher. The ten passengers were four Ottawa salesmen, George Bothwell, Gordon Peverly, James Harper and J. S. John Imlach, four locals William Boehme, Paddy O'Brien, William Murphy and Mrs. William McWhirter and Robert Pachal who was bringing back the coffin containing John Brown's body.

Of these people, only Peverly, Harper and Imlach survived the sinking and were rescued from the frozen bank of Gull Island. Marion (Gates) Lambourne and Mabel (Gates) Benison were told that although their father rescued the three survivors and the coffin with John Brown's body, no recognition has ever been given him.

They recalled that throughout the winter months Dougal Gates worked for the J. R. Booth Lumber Company, while in the summer, he ferried people around on the *Ruby*.

On November 13 1912, he along with several other boats, began the search for the *Mayflower*, "Dad went out and spotted them on Gull Island and rescued them," stated Marion. However, Mabel has a different version. She recalls that her father spotted the three men and summoned another boat to rescue them.

However, in the book, "*Sinking of the Mayflower*" by Stephen Weir, it does state that the men were rescued by the *Ruby*. Throughout the book, it mentions the *Ruby* and Captain Gates, but nowhere does it state that Captain Dougal Gates was in charge of the *Ruby* at the time of the rescue.

The two sisters pointed out that since their father was a shy man, he would never have gone out of his way to seek recognition for his heroic action. It was by pure chance that Captain Dougal Gates was the hero of the story, in that he found the three survivors and chartered them back to the mainland, along with John Brown's body in the coffin.

They reported that Ed Gates, a brother of Captain Dougal Gates, has stated several times that the actions of Captain Dougal Gates have been left out. Ed Gates has stated that he feels Captain Dougal Gates' name should have been included on the stone monument placed at the public wharf in Combermere. This stone monument was donated by the grandchildren of Mrs. William McWhirter, who lost her life in the frigid waters of Kamaniskeg Lake.

In 1967, the Radcliffe Township Council named the public wharf *Mayflower* Centennial Park.

Two years later, Gull Island was renamed *Mayflower* Island. Captain Dougal Gates was born in 1875 and raised in Combermere; He married Mary (Minnie) Agnes **Yondau** June 19, 1901 in Montreal. In 1916/17, he moved to Montreal, Quebec to help with the war effort. In 1959, Captain Dougal Gates died at the age of 84 and was buried in Waterloo, Ontario.

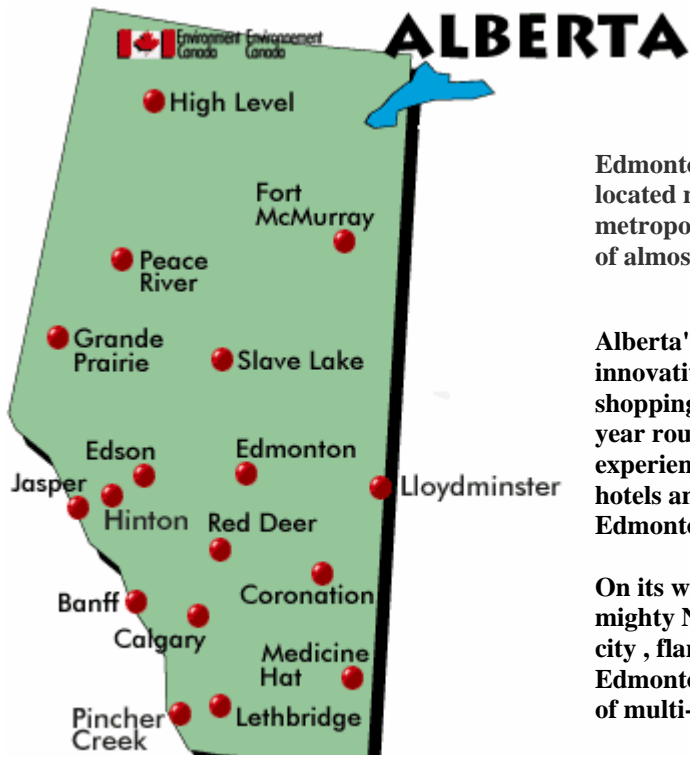

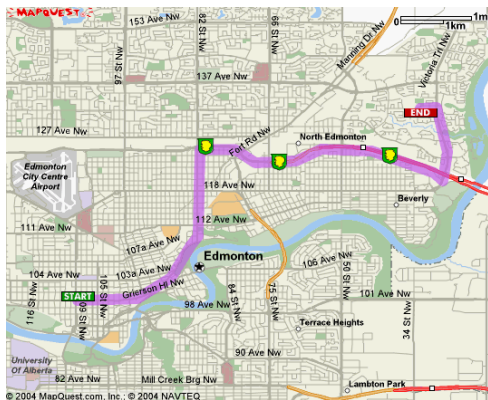
