Our primary focus will be the ancestors and descendants of Francois Guedon & Marie Mollay's son, Pierre Guindon, born 24 Sep 1662, St. Pierre du Marche, Ville du Loudun, township Chaelleraut, diocese Poitiers, Poitou, France.

On the 21st of November 1706 Pierre married Catharine Rouchellet-Braza (widow of Vincellet) at the Notre Dame Church in Montreal, Quebec.

Pierre died on the 26 of September 1733 at St. Francois Ile Jésus, Quebec.

This specialty database relates exclusively to Letter Patents issued by the Lands Patent Branch of the Department of the Interior. The records refer to grants issued in **Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta** and the **railway belt of British Columbia**, c. 1870-1930. Land patents contain only the name of the grantee, the description of the land and the date granted. They do not contain other personal information. Homestead applications and files, which are more detailed, are held at the provincial archives.

Census of the Northwest Provinces, 1906

In order to track the high rates of population growth in western Canada, the Canadian government called for a special census of the prairie provinces (**Manitoba**, and the two newly created provinces of **Saskatchewan**, and **Alberta**). This endeavour continued every 10 years from 1906 to 1956, at which time the Census of the Northwest Provinces became part of the Canada-wide census. Through this research tool you can access digitized images of original census returns, which recorded the names of family members, their sex, marital status, year of immigration to Canada, post office address, etc.(editor note: Canada has yet to release the 1911 Canadian census)

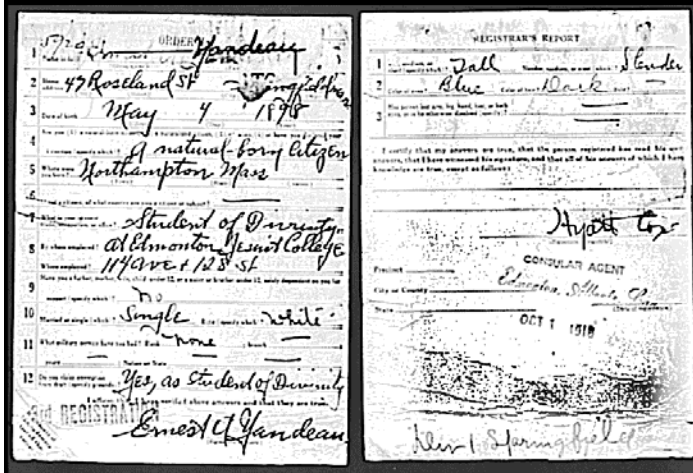

The Yandeau Family of Vankleek Hill, Ontario

From the following article you will see that the Guindon name has many spelling variations. Why? If the person giving their name could not read or write, the recorder spelled it according to the way it sounded to him. Many times it was an English speaking person who not only did not know the French language but found it very hard to pronounce or spell the name when spoken with a French flavor.

Thomas Yondau and his brother Leonard Yandeau were born in Vankleek Hill, Ontario to Jules Guindon and Victoria Aubin. The 2 brothers moved to Combermere, Ontario where they married and raised their families. A sister Sophia Guindon was married abt 1872 to Joseph (Fuller) Fournier in W. Springfield, Hampden Co. Massachusetts. Their first son Joseph was born there. The next 5 children are born in Stockholm, St. Lawrence Co. New York and the last 7 are born in Purdy, Hastings County, Ontario. This too is where Thomas Yondau farmed. Thomas travelled a lot as the family was told he was a voyageur for the Hudson's Bay Company or an insurance agent. When he disappeared and never to be heard from again, his wife Martha Elcome felt he had drowned. This family never had a picture of their father Thomas Yondau (Did Martha destroy any likeness of him?).

Recently it was discovered that Thomas Yondau took another name, Thomas Adams. He had a family of 12 children with his wife Cora Angelina Vaughan whom he married 6 April 1911 in Rose City, Ogemaw County, Michigan. He worked for the railroad in Michigan and the General Motors Company in Flint, Michigan.

Another brother Francois (Frank) Yandoh married Marie

(Cayer) Caille 15 Jul 1861 in L'Orignal, Ontario. When Frank married his second wife Edith around 1880 he was living in New York. Frank's mother, Victoria Aubin was living with him and his family according to the 1880 census for Brasher Falls, St. Lawrence Co. New York. She is listed as a widow. The death record for Frank's father, Jules Guindon, has not been located yet. Thomas and Leonard's sister, Marguerite Yandoh married 3 July 1871 to Louis Bertrand in Stockholm, St. Lawrence, New York. Most of their 10 children are born in Brasher Falls, St Lawrence Co. New York.

We know there was a brother Joseph Guindon b 7 June 1839 and registered in the baptisms at L'Orignal, Ontario. He died at the age of nineteen, 15 Nov 1860 and is buried as Francois Yeadon.

There are 2 pieces to this puzzle yet to solve. Mathilde Guindon baptized 15 Aug 1847 in L'Orignal, Ontario.

Where did she go? Is she in New York or Michigan or somewhere in Ontario? Time will tell!

And then there is the baby brother who is baptized Edouard Guindon baptized 9 Aug 1861 L'Orignal, Ontario. Is he Andrew Yandeau, living on the next farm to Leonard Yandeau in Renfrew County, Ontario as recorded in the 1891 Census?

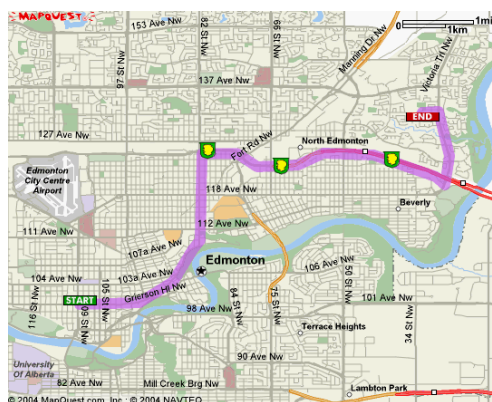
