## BYWARD MARKET HISTORY



The ByWard Market is where Ottawa was born. Established by Lt-Col. John By in 1826, the ByWard Market is one of Canada's oldest and largest public markets. The legendary builder of the Rideau Canal; Lt-Col By, laid out the street plan of the Market, designating George and York Streets to be extra wide to accommodate the horse-drawn carriages that brought foodstuffs to the market every day.

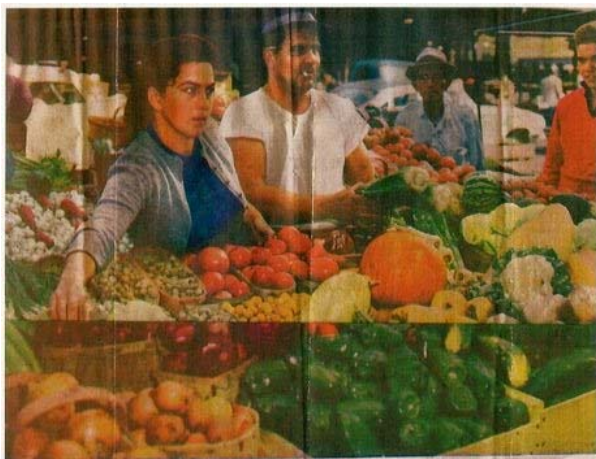
### TODAY

The ByWard Market is Ottawa's number one tourist attraction, and is the premier destination for shopping, dining, arts, entertainment and profession services for residents and visitors. This area averages 50,000 visitors per weekend in the summer months. It is home to both a local farmer's market and artisans with over 260 stands, as well as over 500 businesses. In 2009, the ByWard Market will play host to 6.3 million of the 7 million visitors expected to visit the Nation's Capital in 2009.

Died: 29 Nov. 1972, Orleans, ON. (cancer)  
After Omer died, George and Emma's youngest son **Aurel** ran the market.  
Born: 10 Jan. 1941, in Cyrville, ON.  
Died: 26 Aug. 2006 Cyrville, ON. (cancer)

The second child **Blanche Fournier Groulx** helped out at the market.

Born 16 Apr. 1923, in Cyrville, ON.  
Died in 2005.

**Blanche and husband Wilfred Groulx** had a son called **Richard**. He is now running the market at Byward. So, it is being kept in the family. My cousins visited the Market last summer and found Richard and his wife there. They had a long talk with him about the old days he could remember.

George's parents were **Joseph Fuller/Fournier** born 29 May 1912 Bangor, Hastings County, Ontario and **Marie Sophie Yandea/Guindon** born 18 Aug 1850 in Vankleek Hill, West Hawkesbury, Ontario.

#### Joseph Fuller/Fournier

Born: 15 January 1849, in Quebec. Parents **Jean Hubert Fournier and Marie Dumont**.  
Died: 25 March 1912, in Montreal, Quebec. Brought back to Purdy by train, he was buried March 29 in Roman Catholic graveyard in Maynooth, Ontario, beside his wife **Sophie Yandea**.

**Edward** the third son also died in Montreal, at the Royal Victoria Hosp. 05 Feb. 1914.

He was brought to Purdy by train and buried 07 Feb. 1914 beside Sophie and Joseph at Roman Catholic graveyard in Maynooth, Ontario. There are no markers unfortunately. *Floella (Noonie) Putterill.*

## **Webtree.com Gedcom Individuals**

### **Description**

WebTree.com is a GEDCOM upload site designed to help with printing heirloom-quality charts and graphs for families. Functionality provided by the site includes storing the family tree information online, for free. Beta site functionality began 14th of July, and the site completed this phase 29th July. During the six-week growth period (to the beginning of August), more than ten million names and almost seven hundred GEDCOM's were uploaded to the site. This averages to 250,000 names added per day for the period of site operation. The GEDCOM's stored on WebTree.com are user-contributed information on families whose index is available for free as part of the search results on WorldVitalRecords.com. WebTree.com maintains editing functionality for users, including the abilities to display and edit notes, and any other aspect of the trees. Upcoming site features include photo links, research connection links between different trees based on ancestral relationships, printing features for family trees with pictures, the ability to embed family trees into blogs, and other features built in as users submit suggestions for the site to [support@webtree.com](mailto:support@webtree.com).

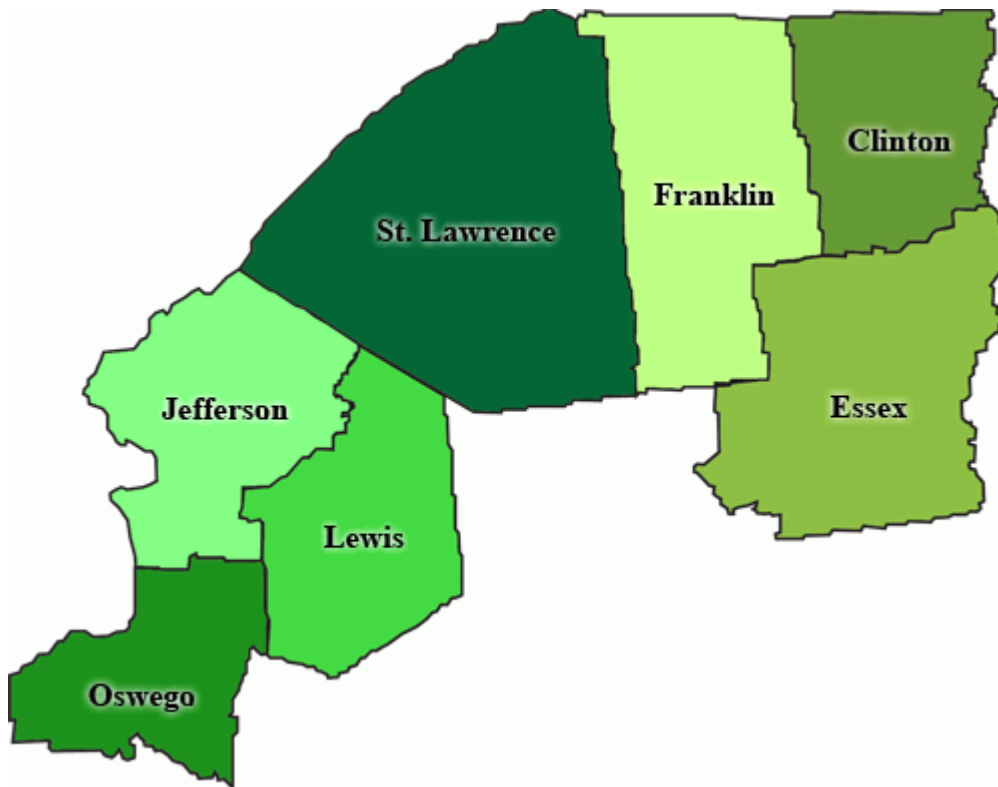

The funeral for Louis H. Yandeau, 80, was held Saturday, Sept. 14, at the Frank Ashton Funeral Home, Rochester. Burial was in the Lowville Rural Cemetery, with military honors.

Mr. Yandeau, a Lowville native and resident of Rochester, died Wednesday, Sept. 11, after a long illness.

Contributions may be made in his name to the crippled children's hospital, 875 Main St., Rochester.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Clinton Thompson, Gouverneur, Mrs. Xavier D'Abrosio, Rochester; nine grandchildren; two great-grandchildren and nieces and nephews.

Born in Lowville, May 6, 1894, a son of Joseph and Sarah Van Wagenen Yandeau, descendants of early settlers of Vermont and Canada who came by covered wagon to settle in Northern New York.

### DEATH OF JOHN YANDEAU

Autopsy Performed to Learn Cause of Death,  
Which Occurred Monday After Brief Illness.

An autopsy was performed late Monday by Drs. A. B. Ilett and M. Lee Smith to determine cause of death of **John Yandea**. No. 453 West Moulton Street, Watertown, who died, after an illness dating from Saturday. Police obtained a nearly empty liquor bottle at the home and it is believed Yandea may have been a victim of wood alcohol. Mr. Yandea was 60 years old. He was born in Deer River, the son of **Joseph and Louisa Ponto Yandea**. His father had been engaged in farming and also in the manufacture of barrels, wooden, tubs and axe handles. After working on his father's farm as a young man, he went to Watertown. about 34 years ago, where he had since resided. He was married 29 years ago to Miss **Ethel Carl**, a dressmaker, of Watertown. She passed away five years ago. On September 16, 1919, he married the present Mrs. Yandea, who was Mrs. **Rose A. Gibbs**. Besides her he is survived by one brother, **George B. Yandea**, of Denver Co.
