HISTORY – HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF UPPER YAMASKA

Following an initial attempt without major aftermath in 1948, it was not until 1967 for a historical society to be formed on a permanent basis in the Granby area. The Historical Society of the County of Shefford, its first name, however, had a difficult start and did not take off until the mid-1970s, a period that coincides with taking charge of the House Vittie and hiring of the first Director General.

The Historical Society works primarily throughout the vast territory of the county of Shefford, remained unchanged in its boundaries since 1855. But with the creation of the MRC de la Haute-Yamaska, in 1982, and the breakup of the former County Council Shefford in four separate administrative entities, the History Society has deemed it necessary, also, to strengthen its activities around Granby and its immediate area, that is to say the 10 municipalities that make up the new regional government. Finally, in 1998, after much hesitation, the Historical Society Shefford harmonized its name with its new administrative and territorial reality, taking the name Social History of the Haute-Yamaska.

The work "Sesquicentennial of Sutton, 1802-1952," by Dyer and Eastman, contributes much to our understanding of the township. William MARSH, Jr. (born 1754) had explored the township in the fall of 1783 and submitted a detailed report to Captain MATHEWS in Quebec. Beginning as early as 1792, some people had taken up residence in Sutton Twp, but between then and 1802, none of these people owned the land on which they resided. According to Dyer and Eastman, "In August 1802, Robert Short Milnes granted lands to 170 Loyalists. These lands formed what is presently the Township of Sutton."

Dyer and Eastman listed the Grantees in both the French and English versions of their text (images 0015 and 0017).

Unfortunately, the lists are not the same. As an aid to researchers who are interested in these original Grantees, I have transcribed the lists of names exactly as they appear in "Sesquicentennial." Both lists apparently contain errors and omissions. Comparing the lists side by side, however, improves our ability to identify the list of Grantees. "Discrepant" indicates that the names are spelled differently or that the name is missing altogether from one or other of the versions.

- The 1802 survey map (I have to check my notes - I might have mislabeled the transcription, below) land Patentees *expected* locations of settlement, from the National Archives patentee documents.

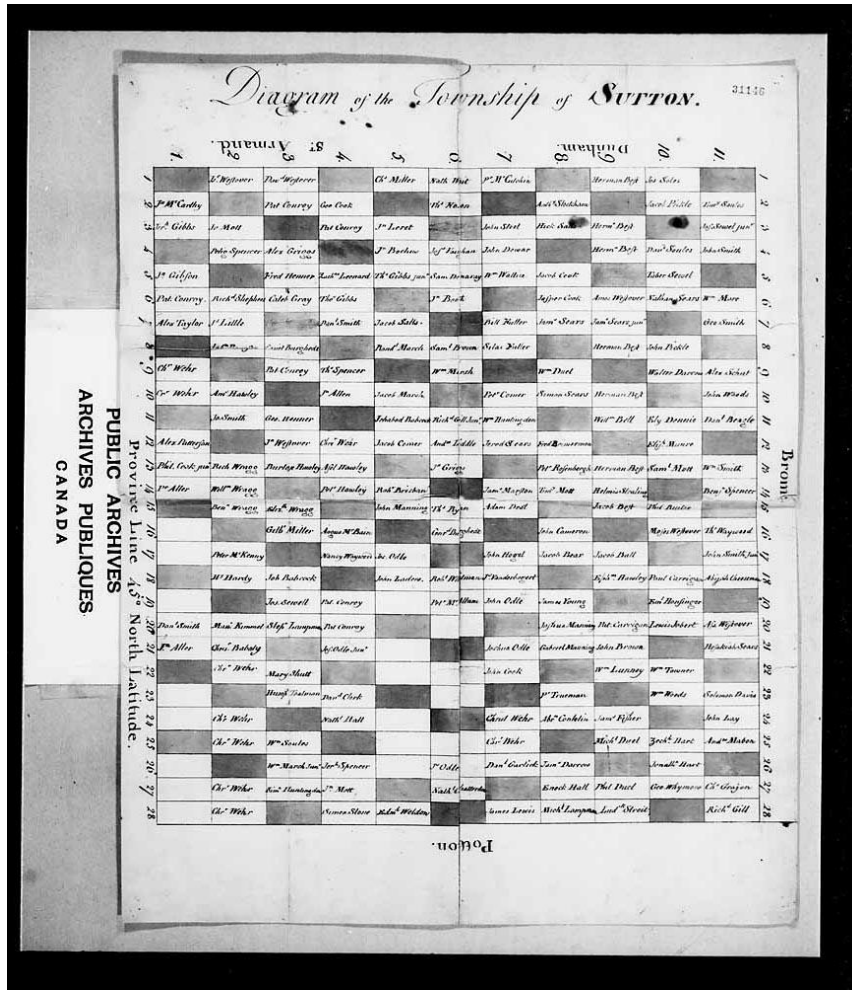
- The land plat transcription showing the *expected* settlement locations
 - A larger, contextualization of the plats within the Quebec province context.
- For those interested the "green square" on the largest map denotes the location of Henry GROAT in Pigeon Hill, Missisquoi Co., QUE - we were trying to make the connection his likely son, Caleb GROAT's land found in the Sutton quadrangle (see the previous two plat maps) that is NOT included in the Sesquicentennial list - but Robert BRISBIN (BISBAIB, below) is - Robert BRISBIN died in 1790, so it is likely his grant was in process of being transferred to his daughter perhaps, Lydia BRISBIN, who m. Caleb GROAT.
- **Please note that the "Free Find" doesn't work as the site was recently updated and needs to be re-indexed – Control+F/Command+F is your "Friend" here :)**

I received an email from my friend (and relative) Joan Rogers and she has the correct spelling for the witness to the Gould Cook wedding in 1900.

She wrote -

I think this name is Bockus.... There were people by that name in Waterloo, Granby and maybe Knowlton. A friend of mine was friendly with Mike Bockus in Waterloo and he had an older brother who married Thora Durrell, she lived in Foster. Thora and I took our business course at St. Mary's Convent in Sweetsburg. 1946/1947. Joan

FAMILY OF JOHN AND ELLEN (RAE) KENNEDY

During the 1800s Irish immigrants heading for Lower Canada landed at the city of Quebec. This was the furthest inland deep water port for ocean going sailing ships. Beginning in the 1820s steamships carried passengers from Quebec to Montreal. These early Irish families settled mostly in the Eastern Township regions of Southwestern Quebec. Around 1827 the **John Kennedy** family became one of the early Granby settlers.

John KENNEDY (circa 1776 – 5 Nov 1846) his wife **Ellen Rae** (Circa 1780 – 1862)

In the early census records all their children were recorded as born in Ireland but from later census records it is clear they must have also lived in Scotland for a time.

John and Ellen share a headstone in the Pinewood Cemetery in Granby with son **William** and his spouse **Anna Butler**; also her parents, **William and Eliza (Cunningham) Butler**.

The Pinewood Cemetery in Granby, Quebec, Canada

John's death is recorded in the Methodist Church. He died 5 Nov. 1846 at the age of seventy. Sons **Watson** and **William** were the Witnesses.

Ellen's death was not recorded, but her headstone gives her birth year as 1780 and death year of 1862. It gives her maiden name, which is the custom of the Irish, and very helpful.

When son **Samuel** married, he is listed as the seventh son. Therefore two sons are missing from this list of children.

The children I have for them are:

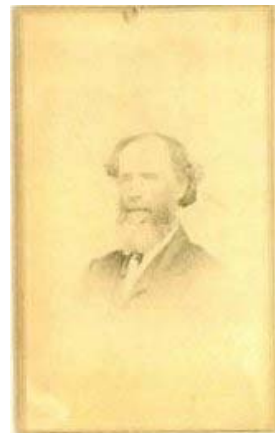
1. **Robert KENNEDY**, (circa 1799, died 22 Jan. 1863 at 63 years.) He did not settle in Granby Township like his parents and siblings, but was not far away in Shefford Township. He married **Frances ASHTON** and had four children according to the 1861 Shefford Census: **John** (b 6 Mar 1835) m **Isabella BURTON** 1861 and moved the family to Plymouth, Hennepin, Minnesota around 1870 (according to Raymond Phillips paulphil@amigo.net), **Robert** (circa 1837), **Walker** (Dec 1838) **Ellena** (circa 1842) **Frances** died Shefford Township 23 Oct., 1849. **Robert Sr.** brothers **Thomas** and **Watson Kennedy** were the Witnesses. **Robert Sr.** married **Elizabeth BELL** at the Anglican Church 4 Nov, 1851 in Shefford. She died 7 May 1894.
2. **Katherine KENNEDY**, (circa 1800). She married **Abram BURNS**. *(See endnote for possible marriage)* They are buried in the Cowie Street Cemetery in Granby. The church records for the church they attended must have been lost, as there are no marriages or births for them or any of their children. Years later, deaths were recorded for them and some of the children. I did find them in the 1842 and 1871 census; he was a shoemaker, so know they were living in Granby. **Abram** died 4 Feb. 1865, aged 86. **Katherine** died 15 Oct. 1876, aged 76. **Abram** and **Katherine** are buried in the Cowie Street cemetery.
3. **James Kennedy**, born 5 Feb. 1806, died 28 Dec. 1879. Aged 73 years. 10m. 23 days. I could find no record of his marriage to **Mary Ann Payne**. MaryAnn died 26 Nov. 1893

4. in the 89th year of her age. She does not show up in the Tombstone readings, but her death was recorded in the church records in Granby. It said burial in the Granby Methodist cemetery. That would be the Pinewood cemetery where James is listed on the headstone. *Surname Connections*: Chamberlin, Brack, Ashton, Aitchison, Wood, Collins.
5. **Thomas Kennedy**, born about 1810, died 20 Sept. 1882, aged 72 years. Married **Sophia Neil** 3 April 1838 Abbotsford, Shefford Co. Quebec. **Sophia**, born 4 July 1813, died 7 Jan. 1889, aged 76 years. Both buried in the Pinewood cemetery in Granby.

Cowansville Observer (Shefford Co. Quebec) 24 Sept. 1885

“Old resident has passed away--**Thomas Kennedy** of Granby Hill, with a cold settled in his lungs on Wed. 20th. Instant at 10:00 a.m.”. *Surname Connections*: Clow

6. **Watson Kennedy** was still in Granby when daughter **Jane Viola** was baptized 12 May 1856. He and spouse **Laura Hill** were in Ogle County, Illinois when their youngest daughter was born. 19 May 1960. Have not been able to find their marriage which would have been about 1841, **Watson** died in Marshall Co. Iowa, 7 Aug. 1884, and is buried in LeMars City Cemetery, Plymouth Co. Iowa. **Laura** died 18 Aug. 1903 Plymouth Co. IA.

Watson Kennedy, formerly of South Granby, Quebec, died at Marshall, Iowa on June 6, 1884, age 73. (they had the date wrong, but place is correct.)

7. **Samuel Kennedy** died 6 May 1881, aged 65 years. He was the 7th. Son. Married **Catherine Lawrence** 14 July 1841 by Special License in the Anglican Church. Shefford Co. Quebec. **Catherine** died 14 March 1902, aged 88 yrs. 2 mos. 23 days. Both buried in the Pinewood cemetery.
8. **William Kennedy**, born Dec. 1819, died 11 May 1895 Waterloo, Shefford Co. Quebec. Married **Anna Butler**, 20 March 1855 Shefford Co. Quebec. **Anna**, born Oct. 1835, died 8 April 1898 at Waterloo, Shefford Co. Quebec. **William** and **Anna** share a headstone in the Pinewood cemetery with **John** and **Ellen**. Also with her parents, **William** and **Eliza (Cunningham) Butler**.

It is a huge, rugged, uneven boulder which came from the bed of the St. Lawrence River. Raised on its end, it stands ten feet high. Weather and more than a century's grime have made it almost black. It looms up, massive and solemn, and broods mysteriously at night. It stands on a grassy island on Bridge Street, near the entrance to Victoria Bridge. Heavy traffic thuds by on both sides. The spot is scarcely peaceful, yet this boulder stands to guard the bones of thousands of Irish immigrants buried there and nearby.
